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Clemson University broke ground Friday, Nov. 2, for a new 28,000-square-foot building to house components of the packaging science and graphic communications departments in what will be the future home of the Sonoco Institute of Packaging Design and Graphics. Clemson University's board of trustees approved a general tuition increase of 5.5 percent for in-state students — \$271 per semester — and 7.5 percent for out-of-state students, which adds \$816 per semester. Even with the fee increase, Clemson will have to implement internal budget cuts, reallocations and efficiency measures totaling nearly \$12 million to help offset state funding cuts, support economic development initiatives and absorb rising energy bills and other mandatory cost increases. Clemson's educational and general budget lost more than \$13 million to a 3 percent state budget cut, inflation, mandatory state pay raises and fringe benefit increases. An overall average increase of 6.05 percent to university housing rates will help pay for technology upgrades and facility improvements, enhancements to living/learning programs, residential life programming and security and inflationary costs. The trustees also approved a 6 percent overall average increase t
