Part III: Significant Events/Situations(i.e., funding changes, financial outlook, and other) -									
Dr. Michael Crow (Columbia University) assumed the presidency of the university in July. The Arizona Board of Regents is discussing new directions for each of the three state universities, with ASU taking on a larger portion of the state's enrollment demand. Revenue shortfalls in the state have resulted in budget cuts of 5% and projections of an additional 10% cut for next fiscal year. Increases in tuition are now being planned at all universities.
