- 1) Opened major classroom facility.
- 2) OIR continues as lead on development of an enterprise decision support system: web accessed, enterprise data warehouse, numerous data marts, comprehensive analytics.
- 3) Financial - 1% hold back, potential of 3% more.
- 4) Headcount enrollment has increased over a five-year period from 22,712 to 27,477;
Credit hours from 224,936 to 298,903.
- 5) One-year retention rate has increased from 70.9% to 81.6% in five years.
- 6) Maintaining diversity, among the non-TBI's, a top producer of African Americans' Bachelor degrees & PhDs.
