Part III: Significant Events/Situations(i.e., funding changes, financial outlook, and other)

- 1) Headcount at an all-time high of more than 28,000.
- 2) Higher admission standards, for both freshmen and transfer students.
- 3) Maintaining diversity, while student body is becoming more traditional (i.e. younger, full-time).
- 4) Base state FY budget cut by 5%, probably an additional 2 1/2%; tuition increase of 15%.
- 5) State is debating means to more effectively award HOPE scholarships.
- 6) Freshman Learning Communities program has grown to 769 students and 33 FLCs, with participation of almost 40% of the new freshmen cohort. Received "Top Rankings" by U.S. News & World Report.
