In Fall 2004, ASU at the Tempe campus enrolled 161 National Merit Scholars, placing the campus among national leaders. ASU at the Tempe campus currently has under construction a number of major new buildings, including the ASU Foundation building, two buildings to house the AZ Biodesign Institute, and two buildings for Interdisciplinary Science and Technology research. ASU recently received a 44 million dollar grant from the DOD to develop flexible flat panel displays. In partnership with the City of Phoenix, ASU has begun planning for a Downtown Phoenix campus. ASU and Mayo Scottsdale are developing collaborative research programs in informatics and bioengineering, and pursuing collaborative educational programs in law, business, and nursing. ASU has signed a memorandum of agreement with the University of Arizona to develop a campus in downtown Phoenix to house joint educational and research programs in biomedicine.
