**Part III: Significant Events / Situations**

- 1 NC State just welcomed a new chancellor, Jim Oblinger, who has been with NCSU for 18 years. He has served as NC State's Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor since 2003. Oblinger served as dean and executive director for agricultural programs of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALs) at NC State from 1997 to 2003, assuming those duties after serving as associate dean and director of academic programs for CALs from 1986 to 1997.
- 2 NC State went through the SACS new reaccreditation process this year, with the off-site review in August 2003, and the on-site visit in March, 2004. The preliminary report showed a positive review and full compliance. Their only request was to clarify the overarching goals of the quality enhancement plan, Learning in a Technology Rich Environment.
- 3 Enrollment at NC State this year was relatively flat, even though we had projected approx 2% increase. Next year's budget has suffered accordingly.
