Part III: Significant Events/Situations(i.e., funding changes, financial outlook, and other) - insert additional rows as needed

In Fall 2005, ASU at the Tempe campus enrolled 155 National Merit Scholars, placing the campus among national leaders. ASU also attracted 72 National Hispanic Scholars, the most ever. An ASU faculty member received the 2004 Nobel Prize in economic sciences, and the campus hosted the final 2004 Presidential Debate. ASU recently completed a new Foundation Building and the first of four planned Biodesign Institute at ASU buildings. Currently under construction are the second Biodesign building, three Interdisciplinary Science and Technology buildings, and the first phase of a new living-learning community for students. In the past year, ASU received six federal grants from NSF, NIH, and DOE totaling more than \$33 million to study means of improving K-12 education in Arizona and the nation. The university also received a \$14.8 million grant from the Gates Foundation to develop a new pneumonia vaccine for newborns. A \$15 million gift has been used to launch a new International Institute for Sustainability. In partnership with the City of Phoenix, ASU is actively planning for a new Downtown Phoenix campus, and the city has just begun the process of acquiring land for the campus.
