Georgia Tech's FY2006 budget totals just over \$1.0B when including our affiliated organizations such as the Georgia Tech Foundation and the GT Athletic Association. The market value of our endowment at June 30, 2005 was \$1.2B as reported to the Council for Aid to Education. While the percentage of Tech's budget attributed to state appropriations has decreased from 34% in 1995 to 25% in 2006, the institution has made great strides in securing sponsored funds and generating indirect cost revenue. Tuition increases have also helped offset the cost of educating our students. Other news of note: our entering freshman class of 2005 has an average SAT score of 1340, our highest average ever. Our first-year retention rate is at 92% while our six-year graduation rate reached 76%, another record high. Our SACS reaffirmation cycle will be completed in early December at the annual meeting. The Quality Enhancement Plan focuses on our undergraduate initiatives involving international study and research.
