The economic outlook continues to look positive in Oklahoma.

The Oklahoma Legislature increased state appropriations by approximately \$80M. Of that, Oklahoma State received an increase of \$3.7M, which is a 3% increase over FY07

The Oklahoma Legislature also passed a bill requiring state institutions to implement an optional guaranteed tuition program for resident undergraduate students to lock rates for 4 years for each entering cohort.

Construction at OSU continues -- groundbreakings for a multimodal transportation facility, a new classroom building and a new interdisciplinary science and technology research buildings have been held over the last 2 months.
